Yes, we're still talking about COVID-19 in July. Amazing, isn't it? But the reality is that it is still among us and this summer will look different because of it. And that's okay. It's okay because God is still God, still loves us, still feels our joys, pains, and frustrations, and still believes in our ability to love this world in a higher, better, third way. This whole year has been a challenging one on many levels, and maybe you're feeling a bit discouraged. Maybe summer is exactly what you need. In between the rain drops of the summer storms, get outside and take in the beauty of God's creation. Let it fill you with peace. For you creative ones, let this season speak to your soul and bring you renewed passion and inspiration. For all of us, take some time to seek God in prayer and meditation. Listen for the voice of the Holy. Read your Bible. Read a novel. Catch up with a friend you haven't spoken with for way too long. Take a day and binge watch a series on Netflix. You get the idea. God meets us where we are and restores our souls in so many ways. Like I said, maybe summer is exactly what you need for a reconnection with God and others.

Speaking of reconnection, we are planning to re-engage with in-person worship services this summer through outdoor services. These will be weather-permitting, and we will also continue to follow state, local, and CDC guidelines for health and safety. We're hoping to have our first outdoor worship service Sunday, July 5 at 11:00 a.m., and we'll be directly in front of the sanctuary near the four trees. To keep us all safe and healthy, we're asking everyone to adhere to the following guidelines:

Please bring your own chair(s) or blanket(s) as we will not be using the cloth-covered chairs from the church.

Please observe 6-foot spacing between you and others (except those in the same family).

The church will remain closed during the extension of Phase 2, which means that there will be no access to restrooms on Sundays.

Please wear face coverings (except for the those under 11 years old). If you forget your face covering, we will have disposable ones available for you. We will also have hand sanitizer available.

As far as singing, we ask you to consider singing "gently" in your mask, or hum, or use the time to center yourself in quiet. Enjoy the music. Let God speak to your spirit.

Bring your own Bible. Yes, we Methodists actually can bring our own Bibles to church.

If we have to cancel a service due to weather, we will notify the church via email and our Facebook page on Sunday morning by 9:00 a.m.

Our outdoor worship services will look a little different. We'll try to keep them short, with less music, no "official" children's time, and no "passing the plate" type of offering collection – although we will have a receptacle for you to drop off your tithes and offerings. In addition, on Sunday, July 5, we will participate in Communion with individually packaged Communion elements. Further, we will continue to offer the online worship service in its current format along with the in-person services.

We recognize that these are unusual times, calling for us to adjust our "normal." God understands as well. After all, God makes adjustments all the time, and most of those adjustments surprise us. So, let's continue to seek God's grace, wisdom, and compassion in the midst of the changes, modifications, and sacrifices. Let's also continue to "Do No Harm" and keep our community safe and healthy. And, let's not forget that it's summertime. Enjoy the season. Looking forward to seeing you all soon!
