WELCOME TO WORSHIP! The word "worship" comes from the old English word for "worthy." When we gather to worship God, we are declaring that God alone is "worthy" of our lives and our praise. The color purple in the sanctuary reminds us that we are in the church season called "Lent." Lent is a period of roughly 40 days (and 6 Sundays) in which we prepare for the mystery and joy of Holy Week and Easter through a time of intentional reflection, repentance, and reconciliation. Christians often observe this season by either giving up something dear to them or by adding a new discipline or routine to their spiritual life, such as giving alms, prayer, or fasting. As you prepare for worship, ask yourself, "How might this season of Lent to be a time of spiritual revival in my life?" Today we begin a Lenten Sermon Series called "Jesus vs. Religion," in which we will be studying Jesus' conflicts with the religious leaders of his day.
